- 1977 Oregon helmet requirement repealed.
- 1979 Rider safety program proposed by A.B.A.T.E.
- 1981 Team Oregon rider safety legislation passed.
- 1988 Voter referendum reinstates helmet require-
 - BikePAC formed for motorcyclists' legislative efforts.
- 1995 Motorcycle helmet definition standardized. (HB-3422)
- 1997 Adult helmet freedom of choice bill passed, vetoed by governor.
- 1997 Federal court equates federal testing standards with Oregon helmet definition.

- 1999 Motorcycle handlebar height regulation repealed.
- 2001 Riders given choice to fuel bikes at service stations. (HB-3885)

2001-2013

Hostile capitol environment to motorcycle legislative efforts.

- 2015 "Dead Red" bill passes. (SB-533) Riders allowed to proceed if light not triggered after one cycle.
- 2017 Reckless drivers held accountable for motorcyclist harm. (HB-2598)
- 2019 Drivers can be held criminally negligent for motorcycist injuries. (SB-810)

Legislators didn't give motorcyclists these victories. We had to work hard together to gain or regain our rights.

I have been in contact with another legislative-minded group as of late, the Concerned Motorcycle Coalition. Our brother Dave Ganslein (a.k.a. "Diesel Dave") is the main push behind this organization. He is working on several bills for 2025 as the session in 2024 is a short one.

His first bill is a reduction of the helmet violation to a minor equipment violation.

Next is refining the definition of alternative motorcycles as transportation in transportation planning and infrastructure. This one should help *BikePAC* efforts in lane sharing. He is also trying to get electric bicycles and electric scooters distinct from motorcycles so that crash statistics do not include them in the motorcycle category.

Dave is also working on several other ideas, but he has lots of energy and knows his way around, so we wish him much success in the coming 2025 session.

I am in contact with Dave as well as BikePAC so will try to keep up with all efforts to motorcycle legislative activity.

Tech Tip

Do you know the difference between a JIS (Japanese Industrial Standard) screwdriver and a Phillips screwdriver?

Have you ever heard of a JIS screwdriver?

Almost every "Phillips" screw head used in North American cars and motorcycles is a JIS screw. Using a Phillips screwdriver on a JIS screw can damage the head and cause it to strip. JIS screwdrivers do not damage the screw head and work just fine with standard Phillips screws too.

Are the cross-type screws on your bike rounded off or damaged?

Have you noticed that the screw head wants to round out once the screw is tight?

It all comes down to the shape of the screw and bit.

If you look closely, you will see that a JIS bit has a tighter radius at the cross and is shallower. The Phillips is more pointed and doesn't bottom out and grip the

cross securely. If the screw is torqued and tight, you can get a rounded-out screw before it loosens.

How can you tell the difference in the screws? The JIS screw has a small dimple on the head. It would be cheap insurance to replace all Phillips screwdrivers in your motorcycle toolbox with JIS drivers. Is the \$12 to \$15 each worth the extra struggle with rounded screws? Use the correct screwdriver.


So many people think: "I don't have the time" or "I couldn't possibly do that job".

Here where I live in Washington county we had about an inch of wet snow that came down on us late last night. Then it melted off today. Wow, maybe there will be enough snow on Mt Hood to go skiing/snowboarding. Yeah, I know the two biggest ski areas have been open on a limited basis but it looks like now the snow sports season can get into full swing since the most recent storms have been dumping enough of the cold white stuff to allow all the ski/snowboard areas in Oregon to open.

I guess I've been kind of a ski bum in the past. Have you tried skiing or snowboarding? You can get going quite fast down the ski slope! Could the experience be compared to riding in the wind on two or three wheels? Yes, a body in motion outside in the wind enjoying the excitement and freedom of the moment.

Can I say that I've had uplifting experiences skiing like I have riding a motorcycle? Yes, and with both I find that while I am doing each activity I ask myself why I

don't do it more often.

Riding a machine in the winter is fine if the rider is properly dressed. Props to those who have electric plug in warming devices on their rides.

In the Washington County Chapter we started 2024 off with our first run committee meeting on the second Monday of January 2024. We met at the *Prime Time Restaurant* in Forest Grove.

Our main membership meeting happens on the fourth Monday of the month at the Hillsboro *Elks Lodge* at 7 p.m.

It looks like we will have the same activities in 2024 as we did last year. Maybe with one less poker run.

The biggest motorcycle show of the year in Oregon will be the 15th presentation of the *One Moto Show* scheduled for the weekend of 19–21 April at the *Zidell* yards barge building in Portland. Should *A.B.A.T.E.* have a booth there?

The big *BikePAC* event will be the *Motorcyclists Awareness Rally* in Salem in front of the state capitol building on the first Saturday of May 2024. This has typically started at noon with speakers sharing with us what's



been happening with motorcycle politics and what the future looks like.

Cold weather puts the test to the motorcycle battery. We are probably riding less during winter months. Some folks don't ride at all during this shivering, dark, wet, snotty nose time of year. We can get lucky though and have a few days during winter that are dry and sunny.

If the bike doesn't want to start the first thing to check is the battery. If the battery is workwise and charged the next thing to look at would be corroded terminal/connections.

Next, check the starter relay switch.

Another possible non starting problem could be the starter solenoid. The electrical contacts inside the solenoid can get corroded and not allow the juice from the battery to make the electric starter engage and spin. With good clean contacts the solenoid [starter?] should spin and make the engine sing the music we so much love to hear.

The running for short periods during the cold season can allow condensation to accumulate inside the engine. Moisture is not good to have in where the moving parts are. This leads to rust and water in the oil.

2025 Oregon Legislative Agenda

- 1. Enact legislation protecting motorcyclists from profiling. Reduce motorcycle helmet regulation from moving violation to minor vehicle equipment violation with minimal fine to discourage profiling.
- 2. Redefine motorcycles as alternative transportation and require all levels of local, county, and state government to include motorcycles in transportation planning and infrastructure.
- **3.** Allow motorcycles to use bus-only transit lanes and any other H.O.V. accommodations.
- **4.** Require O.D.O.T., P.B.O.T., etc. to actively promote May as motorcycle awareness month. Including but not limited to highway reader boards and media placements.
- **5.** Redefine electric bicycles and scooters as separate and distinct from motorcycles. This to insure that crash statistics from these vehicles are not used against motorcycles.


His first bill is a reduction of the helmet violation to a minor equipment violation.

2023: Motorcycle rights in review Legislation protecting our right to repair our own bikes by limiting manufacture's ability to bar self-

repairs, is gaining momentum.

A growing number of legislators and organizations continue to push for year-round sales of E15. E15 gas can damage carbureted and fuel-injected motorcycles, decrease mileage, and reduce the shelf life of gasoline. The fuel is often illegal to use in motorcycles, and labeling at the pump can be confusing. The Consumer and Fuel Retainer Choice Act of 2023 would allow year-round nationwide sales of ethanol blends higher than 10%. A.M.A. continues to push for necessary labeling at the pumps.

Distracted driving continues to be a problem. 19 states introduced legisla on to address this, and 34 states now prohibit drivers from using handheld cell phones while driving.

Only four states, California, Utah, Montana, and Arizona have lane filtering laws. Last year seven states introduced lane filtering legislation. AMA continues to support these regulations to reduce motorcyclist's risk.

2024: What To Watch

- Lane spliting will be introduced in Colorado and will be modeled after Montana's statute.
- Right to repair will continue to be a hot item.

Small icons across the bottom of the user's screen can be clicked on to provide information or to affect how your own video and audio are displayed to others. (Or not.) Of primary use during conferencing is the microphone icon in the lower left corner.

Your own mic should be muted (diagonal slash across it) unless you are speaking.

Otherwise, it's audio chaos.

Please let people know they need to go to votebeforetolls.org to download, follow instructions to print, sign and mail it in. (Washington state just increased their "maximum" toll rate to \$15. That includes the express lane.

Add another \$2 to pay by mail, or \$0.25 per trip to pay by plate.)

I read that co-chair representative Susan McClain (Washington county) indicates toll money isn't necessarily to go toward highway maintenance. A main supporter of HB–2017 (\$5.3 billion taxes and fees), she claims the money is for "multimodal" and to "do something" for transit.




