# **Oregon Goes To Daylight Time Yet Again**

Thanks to the usual legislative waffling over the last two sessions, Oregon riders will once again be subject to jarring their internal clocks when socalled daylight savings time takes effect at 0200 on Sunday, 09 March. (Twelve hours after the state board meeting.)

In the 2024 short legislative session, SB-1548 would have let Oregon stay on standard time year around. But like so much of our own legislative efforts, it passed the senate, but died in committee.

# A.B.A.T.E. and BikePAC Legislative Victories

- 1977 Oregon helmet requirement repealed.
- 1979 Rider safety program proposed by A.B.A.T.E.
- **1981** *Team Oregon* rider safety legislation passed.
- **1988** Voter referendum reinstates helmet requirement.
  - BikePAC formed for motorcyclists' legislative efforts.
- **1995** Motorcycle helmet definition standardized. (HB- 3422)
- 1997 Adult helmet freedom of choice bill passed, vetoed by governor.
- 1997 Federal court equates federal testing standards with Oregon helmet definition.
- 1999 Motorcycle handlebar height regulation repealed.

- 2001 Riders given choice to fuel bikes at service stations. (HB-3885)
- **2001–2013** Hostile capitol environment to motorcycle legislative efforts.
- **2015** "*Dead Red*" bill passes. (SB-533) Riders allowed to proceed if light not triggered after one cycle.
- **2017** Reckless drivers held accountable for motor-cyclist harm. (HB-2598)
- **2019** Drivers can be held criminally negligent for motorcycist injuries. (SB–810)
- **2019** Lane sharing bill didn't pass.
  - Lane sharing bill vetoed by governor.
- 2023 Lane sharing bill died in house transportation committee.

Legislators didn't give motorcyclists these victories. We had to work hard together to gain or regain our rights.

# Josephine County

Are we heading into spring 2025 already?

Well, maybe.

I don't know about you, but I wonder what has happened to global warming. My uneducated opinion is that winters are getting longer and colder. Burr. I know it is still early, but I am ready for the sun to come out and the temperature to warm up.

Did you know that a new study from the *Insurance Institute for Highway Safety* indicates that while high-visibility clothing is more noticeable to humans, it may interfere with automated crash prevention systems?

Researchers outfitted an adultsized dummy with either a black sweatshirt and pants, a retroreflective jacket and black pants, an all-black sweatsuit with reflective strips, and an all-white sweatsuit to test the identification capability of vehicle's the automatic braking systems. The dummy then crossed the road perpendicular to the vehicle's path, traveling 25 miles per hour. The test was conducted several times under three different lighting conditions. "These results suggest that some automakers need to tweak their pedestrian automatic emergency braking systems," I.I.H.S. president David Harkey said in a statement. "It's untenable that the clothes that pedestrians, cyclists, motorcyclists, roadway workers wear to be safe may make them harder for crash avoidance technology recognize."

Being rear-ended on a motorcycle while in traffic is a very real



hazard. More states are exploring legalizing lane filtering to help prevent congestion and being hit from behind, including adding punishments for drivers who impede motorcyclists on the open road.

Minnesota becomes the sixth state to legalize lane filtering, effective 01 July 2025.



#### **Oregon Can Sieze Your** Money

Did you know that the state of Oregon has granted itself

the power to seize your bank accounts that it considers dormant? (If there has been no activity on your part.)

According Oregon to Revised Statutes (ORS) 98.308, if any of your accounts doesn't show owner activity for three years, the bank or other financial institution is required to turn the funds over to the state. If you fail to claim them within three years after that, the state takes your money and you can't get it back.

(Howinhell did that one sneak past voters?)

Yer crusty ol' editor doesn't know what others may think of this action on the part of Oregon, but to him it smacks of illegal seizure of private property and telling people how they must handle their

private finances.

If someone wants to let their money sit in a savings account untouched earning a pitiful amount of interest for several years, that's their business, not the state's.



How much does that thing weigh?




Elections are usually held in May and take effect in June.


