
KLAMATH FALLS CHAPTER REPORT

A matter of growing concern to all of us, is GUN CONTROL! It seems that our rights to keep and bear arms are not as protected by the United States Constitution as many of us had once thought. According to interpretation by the Supreme Court, our Second Amendment rights apply for purposes associated with maintaining a well regulated militia. This seems to be the loop hole used by the community of Morton Grove, Illinois to call an all out ban on mandguns. We may think that Morton Grove is a long ways from Oregon, but San Francisco, Santa Monica and Alhambra California are not. All these towns and more, have proposed similar legislation. Over 400 requests have been made for copies of the Morton Grove Ordinance. The time to write to our State and Federal officials is now, before the man is knocking on our door.

One bit of good news for us Oregon residents, is our rights are protected by Article I Section 27 of the Oregon State Constitution, which has reserved to its people the right to bear arms for the defense of themselves, and the State. Don't fool yourselves into thinking we are covered, because our constitution is also subject to interpretation.

Handguns are only the first step in an attempt for an all out ban on the private ownerships of firearms. People unarmed, are at the mercy of agressors or the current government in control. I was brought up in the belief that the U.S. Constitution guaranteed my rights to keep and bear arms, and it was the duty of every American citizen to rebel against any government that tries to take them away.






