



Run planned for August 1st.







"TECK TIPS"

One of our new additions to the newsletter will be a teck tip each I contacted Howard Campbell and Joe Smario over at Northwest Cycle and ask them if they would work up a teck tip for me each month.

Howard said, "One move that might be over looked if your in a hurry with a plug change is making sure to clean out around the old plugs before you remove them. Use an air hose if possible to remove road dirt and small rocks."

Joe says a little old pebble between a piston and cylinder will leave dynamite scores in the cylinder walls. And if a pebble should get caught under a valve --- pow --- piston, valve contact. So clean around your plugs before you pull them cause it just might save you some big bucks for an overhaul.

Then there is the story in the New England Journal of Medicine (April 29, 1982) of the bartender who flew to the aid of a 60-year-old man who collapsed at a social function. Trained in CPR, the bartender administered successful mouth-to-mouth breathing and chest compression until the paramedics arrived. The man was taken to the hospital and treated for an infarction.

Six days later, he had fever, pus filled sputum and anterior neck pain over the thyroid-cartilege area. Soft tissue radiographs revealed a foreign object in the hypopharynx, which was removed. The foreign object turned out

to be the bartender's dental bridge.

Drs. Shih, Tanaka, Lam, Palmer and Lau of the White Memorial Medical Center in Los Angeles, suggest that all resusitators report missing bridges immediately. They cite the need for resusitators to remove any foreign objects from their respiratory passages that might be transmitted to the victim.





Thanks to Mike Button, Ed Halkyard, Terry Allen and all the others who helped put the SUMMER RUN together and worked at the park during the run.



Motorcycle club members make sure cancer victim achieves lifelong wish

TROY — This year, Larry "Buzzy" Ragen is going to make it to Daytona, Fla. thanks to a little help from his biking friends.

About 125 members of local motorcycle clubs raised \$800 at a small Pawling Avenue bar called The Station Friday night to make sure the "around 30"-year-old Duanesburg man with cancer got his lifelong vacation wish.

"He's always wanted to go down to 'Bike Week;' when bikers from all over the country get together in Florida," said Gary Worden, a friend of Buzzy's ("That's short for buzzard") and The Station's owner.

"We wanted to do it now, because most likely, this is going to be Buzz's last chance to go," added bartender Freddie Kirch.

Attending the \$10-a-head party were bikers from the Capital District Custom Motorcycle Association, Friends of the Road and the Albany and Schenectady County chapters of ABATE (A Brotherhood Against Totalitarian Enactments).

With Worden supplying the space and the Capital District motorcycle group picking up the liquor tab, Ragen's friends were able to "do a lot better than we thought," the bar owner said.

"We got a lot of support from a lot of the neighbors," Worden said, citing food contributions from Mango's Pizzeria and Champ's Food Service. Music also was provided gratis, by the local rock band Smokin'.

In addition, the cyclists received free advertisement of their fundraiser on radio stations WPYX-AM and WQBK-FM, both of which aired announcements of the event throughout the afternoon Fri-

day.
"He was real surprised," Worden said of his friend. "He recently got out of the hospital - he's been in and out a lot and was at home. We got his girlfriend, his friends, to talk to him and let him know the club was going to meet at the bar that night and that he should come out."


He did. Now he's gearing up for his day in the Daytona sun come March.

We're looking forward to seeing the new pins and other identifying paraphernalia ABATE is cooking up for all of us; don't forget our unique calendar too!


