



STATE BOARD MEETING SUMMARY

The June State Board Meeting was held at the Carnival of Foods in Eugene. Representatives from NE Portland, SE Portland, River City, Coos Bay, Lane County, Douglas County, Madras and Klamath Falls were present. Jackson County did not have any representatives.

The Treasurer's report shows that we have \$1,137.51 in the treasury. All bills have been paid except for the new patches. There is still money outstanding from Fossil, but all Fossil bills have been paid. We cleared approximately \$1,100 on the run and spent \$3,896.55.

If you have any suggestions for the run to make it better for next year, let your State Rep know. If you have a run pin coming and have not received it, tell your State Rep.

Lane County Chapter's charter was rescinded and a new chapter formed which is called Emerald Empire. Dave Duryea is the new coordinator for Emerald Empire.



A lot of you robably aren't even aware that this committee exists, but in the future with any kind of luck at all, we will achieve notoriaty in the public eye and therefore make people aware of us and our purposes and therefore make us really effective.

The basic reason for formation of this committee was the promotion of motorcycle safety and to be a sounding board and direct link between the people and the government in any important subject of concern to the


