You don't have to type your letter, But try to write neat enough so it can be read. A hand written not, clearly stating your opinion, is very effective, as compared to a form or mass produced looking letter.

The power of personalized correspondence is that you took the time to do it. You may find the following suggestions helpful.

I. Address your letter properly. 2. Be specific, if your for something, say so and why. If your against something, don't hedge, but tell why. 3. Be businesslike (brief but not terse) 4. Be vocal, tell how a peice of legislation affects you. 5. Be polite, congressmen deserve it, why make somebody mad when you are trying to convert them to your way of thinking. 6. Be reasonable & be yourself. 7. Request specific actions, he's elected to do something. 8. Ask foran answer, he knows where you stand now, find out how he feels. 9. Be appreciative, give thanks for favorable action in the past. IO. Include your address, envelopes get trashed.

One more thing. You are an ABATE member, let them know. Your letter should always be signed with your name and number of the R. I. M. A.

Cyclist awarded \$2 million By MIKE FISH

A Central Square man who suffered severe brain damage and lost his ability to recall events as a result of a 1979 motorcycle accident has won a \$2 million judgment from the company which made an allegedly defective motorcycle helmet the victim wore.


State Supreme Court Justice Thomas Aloi, who heard testimony from a neuro-psychiatrist and neorosurgeon, among others, two days ago awarded \$2 million to Leonard A. Wood, 40, of county Route 4. In addition, the justice awarded \$250,000 to the victim's wife. Carol L. Wood, for loss of consortium.

The defendant, American Sports Co., of Compton, Calif., failed to answer all correspondence from his lawyers, Syracuse attorneys Ralph Manaker and Irwin Birnbaum, according to Manaker.

As a result, Aloi entered what is cailed a default judgment against the helmet manufacturer; that judgment was filed at the courthouse yesterday afternoon.

The accident happened July 22, 1979, when Wood, driving alone, was thrown from his innotoryle while driving south on Route 11 in Collosse. Covered by a helmet made by American Sports Co., Wood's head struck the side of a nearby barn.

Wood, who spent eight weeks in the intensive care unit at Upstate Medical Center, went into a comarcovered from that, lost and regained his ability to remember. Birnbaum said, citing some of the testimony Aloi heard from experts during an inquest into the facts of the case.

This story is about four people: Everybody, Somebody, Anybody, and Nobody.


There was an important job to be done and everybody was asked to do it. Everybody was sure that somebody would do it.
