A.B.A.T.E. and BikePAC Legislative Victories

- 1977 Oregon helmet requirement repealed.
- **1979** Rider safety program proposed by A.B.A.T.E.
- 1981 Team Oregon rider safety legislation passed.
- **1988** Voter referendum reinstates helmet requirement.
 - BikePAC formed for motorcyclists' legislative efforts.
- 1995 Motorcycle helmet definition standardized. (HB– 3422)
- 1997 Adult helmet freedom of choice bill passed, vetoed by governor.
- 1997 Federal court equates federal testing standards with Oregon helmet definition.
- 1999 Motorcycle handlebar height regulation repealed.

- **2001** Riders given choice to fuel bikes at service stations. (HB-3885)
- 2001-2013 Hostile capitol environment to motorcycle legislative efforts.
- **2015** "*Dead Red*" bill passes. (SB-533) Riders allowed to proceed if light not triggered after one cycle.
- **2017** Reckless drivers held accountable for motor-cyclist harm. (HB-2598)
- **2019** Drivers can be held criminally negligent for motorcycist injuries. (SB–810)
- **2019** Lane sharing bill didn't pass.
 - Lane sharing bill vetoed by governor.
- **2023** Lane sharing bill died in house transportation committee.

Legislators didn't give motorcyclists these victories. We had to work hard together to gain or regain our rights.



The following member missed out our cash prize of \$75 for not being at the meetings when their name was called: Terry Gaddes



Other attendees – Joy Reyes (coord), Jack Wingfield, Gene Mortimer, Shirley Huff (Fossil), Michelle [Z] (public relations), Rot Path [Z] (newspaper), James Niece [Z] (web page), Dave Ganslein [Z] (legislative), Aurora (treasurer).

Chapters:

Seven out of eight chapters represented. Seven of seven chapters in attendance were eligible to vote.

Excused chapters –

Central Oregon. Unexcused chapters – None.

Guests and first-time attendees

None.

Minutes – July state board minutes accepted as published in the August state newspaper. Passed by voice vote.

Executive Board Officer Reports

Coordinator – Joy Reyes appreciated everyone coming out as well as everyone on *Zoom*.

The Pacific Northwest Freedom Run (P.N.F.R.) event was not meant to cause problems. It's no good to tear others apart. It's bad to show this to the public. It's best if we come together. I don't tear down any members and I would expect the same respect.

Vice-coordinator-at-large – Jack Wingfield had nothing to report. Recording secretary – Joey Taylor (Absent) No report.

Membership secretary – Glenna Grosen (Absent) No report.

Treasurer – Aurora Josephson reports accounts had the following balances: \$10,412.18, \$12, 829.20 for a total of \$23,241.38

- There is an outstanding bill for portable toilets at *Fossil Campout* for \$3,000.
- As of 01 August, \$121.84 is in the *P.N.F.R.* account.
- We deposited \$2,000 into the *P.N.F.R.* account after August first, and wrote a check for \$1,500 toward the Madras fairground fee. The remaining \$4,950 of the fee for Madras fairground was covered by the *A.B.A.T.E.* of *Oregon* main checking account.
- Today, I will deposit an additional \$1,600 into the *P.N.F.R.* account and transfer \$1,500 of that into the *A.B.A.T.E.* checking account, in partial reimbursement of the fairground fee, leaving \$3,450

covered by A.B.A.T.E. of Oregon. After the event, the A.B.A.T.E. checking account will be fully reimbursed for all monies borrowed.

• There was a long discussion about whether or not the board ever voted on *P.N.F.R.* as an *A.B.A.T.E.*—sponsored event. (per Joy)

It was voted on one way or another about five times.

Jack reminded us that we had a discussion about unavailability of insurance if this was to be a multistate event. At that time it was decided that this would be an *A.B.A.T.E. Of Oregon*—sponsored event and that we would accept donations/sponsorships from other organizations from other states.

Joy has been talking about this at every meeting since we first talked about this over a year ago. There was a special board meeting held on 27 July 2025 where a vote was taken to move forward on the *P.N.F.R.* [Minutes of that meeting are in the August state newspaper. --c.o.e.]



HR-3385 Definition of a Motorcycle



















U.S. congressman Derrick Van Orden of Wisconsin has introduced a bill that directs the secretary of transportation to update the nearly 60-year-old federal definition of a motorcycle.

In recent years, a new type of vehicle has entered our roadways, commonly referred to as an autocycle. These autocycles are classified as motorcycles at the federal level, but have little

resemblance to a motorcycle. The operational characteristics vastly different.

The Motorcycle Riders Foundation believes this ambiguity about autocycles created has unnecessary patchwork of rules and regulations regarding licensing, insurance, safety statistics, registration, and training courses from state-to-state.

N.H.T.S.A. Cancels Motorcycle Advisory Council

Jay Jackson, *Motorcycle Riders Foundation* vice-president and appointee to the U.S. motorcyclist advisory council (M.A.C.), was notified by the national highway traffic safety administration (N.H.T.S.A.) that his appointment has been terminated.

We are shocked and disappointed by this decision and are still gathering information. It appears the other appointees have received similar notifications.

The M.A.C. was created by an act of congress in November 2021. Yet

despite a requirement in the regulation to establish the M.A.C. within 90 days, it took until 2023 for the nomination process to begin. It wasn't until the summer of 2024 that the members of the M.A.C. were selected.

The inability of N.H.T.S.A. to convene the 13-member board is a slap in the face to the nearly 10 million motorcyclists in this country. The mandate of the M.A.C. was to advise the secretary of transportation, the administrator of the national highway traffic

safety administration, and the administrator of the federal highway administration regarding transportation safety issues of concern to motorcyclists, including motorcycle and motorcyclist safety, barrier and road design, construction and maintenance practices, as well as the architecture and implementation of intelligent transportation system technologies.

technologies.

M.R.F. president, Kirk "Hardtail"

Willard, said of the decision, "This is a striking example of how the

concerns of motorcyclists are ignored. If you aren't upset, you aren't paying attention."

The *M.R.F.* has already contacted members of congress, including those on the congressional motorcycle caucus, to alert them of this unacceptable action by bureaucrats in D.C.

This fight is just beginning. Be alert for upcoming messages from the *M.R.F.* on how you can voice your displeasure with actions that threaten the safety of bikers.



MOTM 2000

It reads, "in appreciation to ABATE of Oregon for protecting the rights and interests of our nation's motorcyclists." This was for getting freedom of choice planks on the Democratic and Republican Party platforms and had not been done before in Oregon or anywhere else. It was quite an honor to receive this award in behalf of all the members of ABATE of Oregon. Well-done people.

I would also like to thank ABATE of Oregon for sending me to the Meeting of the Minds 2000, "Going Global." This was a great experience that I will always remember.

There was a lot going on and it was hard to decide what secessions to go to. Teresa Hepker and Ken Ray were in attendance also. We split things so there wouldn't be duplication of attendance to the secessions. These secessions included:

- "Positive Public Relations" with Kirk Willard,
- "How to Argue the Helmet Law Using Statistics Instead of the "F" Word" with Vince Piacanti,
- "Understanding the State Rep and Member Recruiter Program" with Don Fawley and Wayne Thomas,
- "A Decade of Consumerism" with Fred Rau,
- "Motorcycle Consumer News",
- "What Successful People Do" with Slider Gilmore,
- "Freedom of Information Act" with Todd Vandermyde,
- "Workshop for First Time Attendees" with Rick and Gail Gray,
- "Budgeting for Your SMRO" with Dave Mann,
- "Working With the Media" with Larry Schwartz,
- "Leadership Principles" with Wayne Thomas,
- "Running for Public Office" with Gary Klinker,
- "Strategic Planning for Your SMRO (Part 1 of 2)" with Tom Pauley and Mark Buckner.

There were several general secessions which every one attended.

The first general secession was "A Panel Discussion on Global Harmonization" With panel members Tom Pauley of MRF, Tom Wyld of MRF, Ed Michel from Harley Davidson, James Marsol from Freedom Riders of the Philippines, Rob Rasor from Federation of International Motorcyclist, Ray Monroe from BMW Motorcycle Owners of America, Erwin Renette from Federation of European Motorcyclist Association, and Scott Thornton from AMA. The format of the panel discussion was around specific questions with each member giving his answer to the question.

The first question was "What is some common ground that we can all work together?" Ed Michel stated that HD had work with FEMA to eliminate 43 different motorcycle production regulations. Ed further stated that

environmental regulations will become law and they will drive the cost of ownership of a motorcycle higher. Tom Pauley says we can impact state and local governments. which make the laws. Erwin says agree to disagree. He said the issues and interests are the same on both sides of the pond. James Mrasol stated there was a two up riding ban in Japan was successfully repealed with HD's help. He also said there were many issues unique to his part of the world but stated there is also a lot of commality in problems we all face.

The next question was "what role will aftermarket parts play?" Rob Rasor was the only one to answer this question. He stated we have to educate ourselves and get involved and bring on board after marked suppliers because its in their best interest to get actively involved or there won't be any aftermarket. Once the European Bike Standards get adopted, this will mean the end of aftermarket suppliers, as we know them.

The last question was "What's happening in the United Nations?" Tom Wyld stated companies must make a profit for their stockholders. To due this they must import their ideas to other markets. Ed Michel said NHTSA stated that global harmonization will occur and NHTSA will protect us, the motoring public, from ourselves. Rob Rasor said FIM has NGO (nongovernmental organization) status in the UN. This gives them access to what is other wise closed to outsiders. They can testify at committee hearings in motorcycles behalf. All of the panel members had these tips on what motorcyclists should be doing now.

- Get involved and vote in the up coming elections.
- 2. Build our membership up in any SMRO we can join and build coalitions with other groups with similar interests.
- 3. Be involved in the political process, we can impact legislative process. Bureaucrats are aware of us and we need to let them know what we want.
- Use international exposures to effect changes. (UN)
- 5. Use biker friendly media to get our message out. If they are unfriendly, write letters to the editor on a single issue. All papers will print a single-issue wellwritten letter to the editor. We must keep getting our message out.
- 6. To make an impact at a local level form coalitions with other groups and show up at public meetings with these people. Their interests are probably the

Teresa Hepker gave an update on the National Agenda for Motorcycle Safety. This was an update from the Blue Ribbon Conference of last November. The final report should be released by December. We don't know what the final report will say but we can hope many of our areas of concern will be addressed.



IT IS HEREBY ADJUDGED AND DECLARED that Oregon House Bill 3422 means that as long as a motorcycle rider is wearing a protective covering on his head that has a hard outer shell, padding adjacent to and inside the outer shell and a chin-strap retention system with a sticker indicating that the motorcycle belinet meets standards established by the United States Department of Transportation the rider is in compliance with state law with respect to his helmet and a police officer may not inquire further to determine if the helmet worn meets United States Department of Transportation testing standards.




