Frequently Asked Questions

What is A.B.A.T.E.?

We are a State Motorcycle Rights Organization (S.M.R.O.) dedicated to educating riders, drivers, and elected officials about issues affecting motorcyclists.

We help fund a political action committee (*BikePAC*) that directly interacts with the legislature about motorcycles issues and bills that affect us.

What does "A.B.A.T.E." mean?

A.B.A.T.E. stands for *A Brotherhood Against Totalitarian Enactments*. The organization was formed when legislators passed bills adversely affecting riders without consulting them.

We also do business as *A Brotherhood Aimed Towards Education*.

What is BikePAC?

Founded in 1988, *BikePAC* members track legislation, brief officials, and report to *A.B.A.T.E.* about issues affecting motorcyclists.

Easyriders magazine editor Lou Kimzey issued a plea in issue #3, October 1971, for bikers to come together to fight impending restrictions from the National Highway Transportation Safety Administration (N.H.T.S.A.) by joining a new national biker's rights organization called the *National Custom Cycle Association*. But because of a conflict with the acronym the name was changed in February 1972 to *A Brotherhood Against Totalitarian Enactments* (*A.B.A.T.E.*).

Easyriders began granting state charters around 1974. Keith Ball was the original national coordinator.

The biggest threat was that the U.S. D.O.T. (Department of Transportation) was investigating ways to restrict modified or customized "choppers" which they deemed unsafe, especially extended forks.

As the rights movement grew, Don Pittsley, a member of the *Huns Motorcycle Club* in Connecticut

convinced his congressman, representative Stewart Mckinney, to introduce HR -3869 to end the federal authority to withhold highway funds from states without helmet requirements.

In July of 1975, Rob Rasor (*American Motorcyclist Association - A.M.A.*), Ron Roloff (*M.M.A. of California*) and Ed Armstrong (*A.B.A.T.E. of Chicago*) presented the house sub-committee on surface transportation with convincing testimony to repeal the helmet mandates.

Later that year, with California being sued by the D.O.T. because governor Ronald Reagan refused to comply with the federal helmet requirement, Roloff helped convince California senator Alan Cranston to offer the language of the bill as an amendment to the *1975 Federal Highway Act*, which passed with overwhelming support from the California delegation because of the impending lawsuit. I was signed by president Gerald Ford on 05 May 1976.

Not bad for a rag tag bunch of bikers with little or no previous political ambitions.

As a result of our newfound political clout, motorcyclists have successfully approached congress twice over the past few years, first to grant federal protections against insurance discrimination based on mode of transportation because many companies were denying medical benefits to employees injured in motorcycle crashes.

Then, [in the 1998] session, motorcyclists united to put together a proactive agenda for bikers, and succeeded in lobbying it through congress.

So, there you have it.

The roots of *A.B.A.T.E.* and biker's rights run deep in the hearts of those of us who have accepted and, in turn, passed on the torch of freedom of the road.

TextHello everyone,

It has certainly been quite a summer.

We have seen a higher-than-normal number of motorcycle crashes across the state of Oregon. It is a sobering reminder of why the work we do as an organization is so important.

This is exactly why we need to remain active, visible, and committed to what we stand for as *A.B.A.T.E. of Oregon*.

Motorcycle safety, awareness, education, and protecting the rights of motorcyclists are responsibilities we all share.

I can speak from my personal experience this year. For the first time in more than 40 years of riding, I experienced my own motorcycle incident. It is a reminder that something can

happen to any one of us, at any time, regardless of our experience level.

I also want to emphasize the importance of chapters supporting other chapters and attending each other's events whenever possible.

When an event is being held within a reasonable distance, particularly within approximately 100 miles, please make an effort to show up, participate, and support your fellow *A.B.A.T.E.* members. Our individual chapters are important, but we are ultimately one organization working toward the same goal.

The strength of *A.B.A.T.E. of Oregon* comes from our willingness to support one another. When we attend each other's events, volunteer, participate, and

stand together, we demonstrate just how strong the motorcycle community can be.

I would also like to give a big thank-you to the Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT) for its efforts to promote motorcycle safety and awareness on Oregon's freeways and highways through billboards and overhead message signs.

Seeing motorcycle safety messages on Oregon's roads is an important step forward. These reminders help keep motorcyclists visible and encourage all motorists to be more aware of motorcycles sharing the road.

This effort is important not only to *A.B.A.T.E. of Oregon*, but to the entire motorcycle community.

Organizations such as *BikePAC*



of *Oregon, Motorcycle Riders Foundation (M.R.F.)*, and the *National Coalition of Motorcyclists* have also worked hard to promote motorcycle safety, awareness, education, and motorcyclists' rights.

We all have an important role to play in addressing issues that affect motorcyclists, including legislation, motorcycle regulations, safety, education, and our right to choose what we ride on the roads of Oregon and throughout the United States.

Membership processing has a time lag (two weeks) due to mail pick up from Albany address. Membership materials mailed directly to Karen get processed within a week.

State treasurer – Aurora Josephson

Savings balance = \$22,320.40

Checking balance = \$4,300.

Fossil expenses = \$12,833.98

Fossil income = \$10,153.66.

There are a few outstanding profits not yet added in and hopefully no outstanding bills.

Legislative report – *Diesel Dave* Gansheld noted that Paula Leslie (*BikePAC*) met with state representative Susan McCain concerning motorcycle issues. They discussed autonomous vehicles and the *Motorcyclist's Bill-of-Rights*, which she offered to co-sponsor.

Oregon's transportation bill was defeated in the May election by an 83% to 17% margin.

Fossil coordinator – Shirley felt that this year's *Fossil Campout* was a success. She believes that everyone who came for the weekend had a great time.

Had 237 people through gate. (Nine more than 2025.)

Quite a few newcomers.

Three new members joined at *Fossil*.

Lots of first-time attendees plan on coming back.

Next year (2027) will be *Fossil Campout's* 50th anniversary. Attendance should be greater.

Making notes on people's comments so far.

Looking at event schedules from last few years.

Event poster was displayed at information booth.

Need to have state and chapters involved with running *Fossil Campout*. Chapter sergeant-at-arms need to help out with security.

October is when we do the planning session and that's when the budget set.

Need to vote now on holding *Fossil* next year so advanced publicity and fliers can be begin circulating.

Jay Cee suggested that every chapter volunteer for *Fossil* tasks. Need promotion and vendors. Have price list with different rates. Reducing prices would increase attendance. Becoming member would be \$10 discount on ticket price.

Shirley changed to simplified pricing to keep gate training simple.

Fer Rot Path, it was thirty-one years ago this month that yer future crusty ol' editor joined *A.B.A.T.E. of Oregon*.

It was a bit of happenstance.

The year was 1995.

Yer c.o.e. had only been riding his Rot Cycle a couple of years. (1980 *CX-500* bagger.)

He was gettin' tired of being a lone wolf rider and was lookin' for some motorcycle group to join.

Salem Chapter of *Oregon A.B.A.T.E.* happened to be holding a run only a couple of miles away on the Willamette river south of Independence. John Kay of *Steppenwolf* fame was going to be there.

It was too good of an opportunity to pass up.

So Rot Path putted on over Saturday morning, the 5th of August, paid his money at the gate, then found a shady spot to park his bike. (At least it didn't fall over like it did the first time he went to *Beaver Creek Run*.)

Headin' down towards the river, he paused to take in all that was going on.

Some woman came past him, giving a little pat to his saddle pad while remarking, "Nice butt."

(Yeah, it could have been sarcastic, but Rot Path was considerably less weighty in those days and in in reasonably good shape, so he chose to take it as a sincere compliment.)

In that moment he decided he liked motorcycle runs.

The stage was practically set up in the river, with John Kay and his band arriving by boat.

Of course they played, *Born To Be Wild*.

It was all such a positive experience that Rot Path stopped by an old surplus army tent that the chapter had set up as an information booth. There he got to talking

with J.C. Russell about *A.B.A.T.E.*, what it did, what its goals were. That sounded a lot better than a motorcycle club or group, so Rot Path ended up joining right there and then. (His motorcycle name was the result of prison video he helped edit at access television.)

Rot Path began going to the *Salem Chapter* meetings at *Pietro's Pizza* on Market street in Salem. He was feeling a bit lost because he didn't know anyone in the chapter. (Except J.C. Russell, who was also a modeler like him.)

At one of the meetings they had visitors from the Portland area, including Ken Ray and Rotten Roger. When Rot Path remarked that he didn't know anyone, Ken's advice was to volunteer for a chapter officer position.

So when unfortunate circumstance led to the chapter secretary position becoming open, Rot Path volunteered for it. (Don't listen to those short-sighted folks who think they're being clever by chanting, "*Never volunteer!*" Every time Rot Path has volunteered, his life has only gotten better.)

As chapter secretary, he began submitting chapter reports to the state newspaper in 1996, using what he thought was biker speech. Often his reports would squeak in at 2359 on the due date. (That's 11:59 p.m. to those who haven't learned the

Legislative Report

Greetings,

July is traditionally a slow month in Oregon politics.

• The noteworthy event this month: was the failure of IP-28 to qualify for the November ballot.

IP-28 (*P.E.A.C.E.* act) would have prohibited any form of hunting, fishing, harvesting or agricultural production of animals in Oregon.

Many signatures on this petition were found to be invalid.

• I met with Portland city council president, Jamie Dunphy, to discuss progress on the *Motorcyclist's Bill-of-Rights*.

Councilor Dunphy assured me that "*After the funding debate regarding the Moda Center is concluded, the M.B.R. will move forward in the city council.*" Probably this fall.

• Representative Thuy Tran's community affairs director, Tommy Jarvis, and I will meet in early September to draft a resolution/legislative concept of the *M.B.R.* to take to the Oregon legislature in the 2027 session.

• The city of Las Vegas has approved deployment of *Zoox* robotaxis.

• The *University of Minnesota*, in conjunction with *Minnesota Zero Deaths* conducted a seminar on reducing ~~accidents~~ crashes involving electric bikes.
